Beef Quality Assurance

Beef Quality Assurance is a nationwide certification program to help ensure a safe, wholesome and quality beef product for consumers. A few of the topics covered are cattle nutrition, handling, and vaccine protocols.

To be certified, producers must:

1. Attend a BQA classroom training or complete a self-study and satisfactorily pass a written test.
2. Attend a chute-side training.
3. Establish a Veterinary Client Patient Relationship and complete a VCPR validation form requiring signature of operation's veterinarian.
4. Sign a BQA Contract.
